



Anzac street parades axed in Hauraki

There will be no veterans, service members or family marching down the centre of Hauraki's streets on Anzac Day this year, after the Hauraki District Council decided against providing funding for the parades.

Instead, the Paeroa and Waihī RSAs will be marching along the footpath on April 25, while Hauraki RSA will follow its route from previous years, through Hugh Howard Domain in Ngatea.

The council runs three Anzac civic services each year - in Paeroa, Waihī, and Ngatea town halls.

Although the preceding parades are managed by the RSA organisations and not the council, in past years the council has had a specific budget set aside for Anzac Day parades.

This funding allocation was removed during the council's annual plan deliberations.

A report tabled at the council's March 27 meeting showed Paeroa RSA requested \$3475 of discretionary council funding for its parade; Waihī RSA requested \$4075.

Hauraki RSA's route through the domain does not require funding for traffic control.

At the meeting, the council decided the traffic management costs were too high, and instead opted to contribute \$500 apiece

to each RSA's Poppy Fund.

"In recent years, the cost of road closures for Anzac civic services in our three main centres – Waihī, Paeroa and Ngātea, has risen significantly. At the same time, we've observed a shift, with more veterans and attendees choosing to gather in local halls rather than participate in the traditional march," Hauraki Mayor Toby Adams said.

"In response, the council has decided to support the RSA in each town with a direct donation to the Poppy Fund.

"This ensures that our contributions provide tangible assistance to those who need it most while still honouring the spirit of Anzac Day."

The council-led services in the halls will still run as expected.

Paeroa RSA president John Hallett said the RSA felt the parade should be a civic service.

"We will simply walk along to

the town hall, it won't be a formal parade... the council have decided they don't want that cost," he said.

"It's a little bit too late to fundraise for it, [and] the RSA also is busy trying to get as many funds as they can to restore their dear old building in the near future, and so they don't want to bear the cost. Next year might be a different story."

Waihī RSA president Ellen Henderson said its members would proceed in formation along the street instead of up the middle of the road.

"It'll only be two or three abreast, but we will carry on doing the march because that's part of Anzac," she said.

Services Academy kicks off at Hauraki Plains College

A group of Hauraki Plains College students attended a two-week induction course at Trentham Military Camp on March 9 as part of a new leadership and life skills course at the school - The Services Academy Programme.

HPC Services Academy director Paul Dodds, who joined the students at the induction course, told *The Profile* the aim was to introduce students to the ethos and values of the Academy through military style methodology.

The course fostered teamwork, and helped set foundations for continued training, education and personal development, Paul said.

It prepared students by "putting them in an environment where there was nowhere to hide", he said.

"It increases their comfort zone and taps into their inner self, so they become self motivated, thinking people, capable of setting their minds to something and achieving it."

Year 12 students Reuben Dodunski and Sameera Hayes were two members of the Services Academy students who attended the induction course.

Sameera said the experience helped her as she wanted to join

the police force one day, while Reuben said he wanted to get into the army next year.

After having a taste of what it would be like, Reuben said "I feel I could go into the army".

Both students said they learnt basic marching and did a lot of physical fitness training to prepare for the course.

One of the activities the group had to do was a timed circuit of the assault course at Waiouru Army Camp, Reuben said.

"We had to get everyone through, so working together was huge."

Some of their daily routines included marching to and from breakfast, lunch and dinner, which was around two kilometres altogether, and also their morning routine which consisted of a shower, beds made,

rooms tidied and boots polished, they said.
"It made us appreciate what

One stand out moment for the young cadets was when everything went "belly up", they said. A cue from Paul pulled them

A cue from Paul pulled them up and reminded them they were a team and needed each other to succeed, they said.

Effective communication and learning people's strengths and weaknesses were some of the leadership skills Reuben said he developed.

Meanwhile, Sameera said she became a stronger person, and learned how to work better as a team.

"We made it together, pushing through all the challenges, building friendships and becoming closer as an academy," Sameera said.

The young cadets said they were glad they joined the Services Academy.

If given the opportunity to attend the induction course again, Reuben and Sameera both said they would do it, and their advice for other students was the same.

"Do it! Take the opportunity, you will never know when you will get the chance to do it again."

But to win you need to drive hard and push to the limit of being in a 'crash' if that makes sense.

"If you hold back, you can get

lost in the opponent's smoke because you are behind them, rather than beside them, which then creates more risk of losing your battle or crashing, said."It also looks really bad on TV if you are not keeping up with them.

Deane, a former student of Pārāwai School in Thames and now a Paeroa local, said he gets plenty of hometown support, with D1NZ even commending him for putting Paeroa "on the

New factory churns out half a ton of butter daily



As part of a Valley Profile series, **MEGHAN HAWKES** searches through old newspapers to bring you the stories Thames Valley locals once read about themselves.



m he}$ Paeroa dairy factory, situated near the Te Aroha Bridge, had been built on the very latest plans, and all the machinery and appurtenances were the most up-to-date.

The roof was covered with rubberoid, so that an even temperature was maintained inside the building.

The floor in the separator room, churn room, engine room and boiler room were all concrete. The freezing chamber and chilling room were insulated with pumice and double lined inside and out.

At its completion the factory turned out over half a ton of butter daily and upwards of 500 boxes of butter were manufactured, 300 of which were exported, the rest being sold for local consumption. All the butter sent for export was awarded first grade by Auckland's Government Grader.

Meanwhile, over at Hikutāia,

a launch named *Milkmaid*, was built to the order of Mr J Morrison, mainly for the purpose of conveying milk to the Netherton Creamery.

An Ohinemuri Gazette reporter was invited for a cruise on the vessel, and hardly had he taken his seat when the launch was off, gliding through the water at a good pace.

The craft was 30ft long and a beautiful model, in fact one of the most pleasing yet turned out in the colony. The engine was four-horse power and one of the Union Oil Company's latest oil engines.

The boat attained a fair rate of speed - the trip from Auckland to Hikutāia accomplished in seven hours and 50 minutes, and the journey from Mr

Morrison's farm to the Railway Wharf taking one hour and three quarters. Oil engines were now rapidly coming into favour and being largely used throughout the colony.

In Waihī, telegraphic arrangements were inadequate and there was an immediate necessity for alterations to the telegraph line. There was only one branch wire for the entire district, the staff insufficient, and the building too small. The duplex system needed to be installed at once, and, if necessary, the quadruplex system be introduced into Paeroa, so as to relieve the line there. It was also necessary to alter the course of the wires, so as to avoid the long curve to Waitekauri.

Meanwhile, excursionists

Wakatere to see the Auckland-Thames football match had a somewhat unpleasant experience. Between four and five hundred people attended expecting to leave again at midnight. When the time came to get away, the tide was not high enough to float the steamer and all attempts to get her off failed.

Those who were fortunate enough to sleep all night found on waking that instead of being alongside the Auckland wharf they were still at Thames.

Some of the excursionists who could not get accommodation on the steamer walked round the town all night, while others were able to get beds in the hotels.

Everybody was looking forward to getting away in the afternoon, but the Wakatere, even with the help of the tugs Patiki and Kopu, would not move. At this stage, the Awarua came down from Kōpū and many of the excursionists boarded her to return to Auckland, thankful beyond measure at the prospect of a good night's sleep.

Meanwhile, another steamer had been wired for from Thames, and the Taniwha was sent, reaching Auckland with the rest of the excursionists around 10 the next morning. The Wakatere was eventually taken off the mud.





Recently, I had the privilege of sharing about our youth work at the

Paeroa Lions. I was also asked to give a bit of inspiration and wisdom.

"Like those articles you write," the gentleman said.

As I sat in that room - at least 20 years younger than the next youngest person there - I felt like a child among giants. Imposter syndrome hit hard. Who am I to give inspiration or advice to this group? The wisdom of just one of them would dwarf mine. The combined life experience in that room made me feel like I didn't belong.

But as I mixed and chatted, I relaxed. I was struck by the humility in that room. These men weren't there to puff themselves up. They were there to connect, to laugh, and to serve their community.

One of the younger men in the room - in his early 6os - pointed out some of the older ones and shared how much he admired them. After years of hard grind in a trade or on a farm, these men still roll up their sleeves

and muck in. These are men

worth looking up to.
And as I looked around, I felt a twinge of sadness. So much wisdom. So much character. So much experience to be shared. Yet, where were the people of my age?

The Lions, like many in their generation, are more than willing to support, mentor, and journey alongside younger people. They'd love to see new blood coming in. But they don't always know how to communicate the beauty of what they offer in a way that resonates with us

way that resonates with us.
And honestly? I don't think
it's their job to change and fit

into our world.

It's our job to seek them out. We should come with humility, eager to learn from the life lessons they've already paid for in time, effort, and scars.

So today, this is a shameless plug - not just for Lions Paeroa but for the entire boomer generation.

I'm a millennial, now the patriarch for my children in the Wilkes line. My grandfather and father both passed within a year of each other. But I cherish the time I had with them. Before my grandfather passed, I sat with him, listened to our family history, heard the stories, and

soaked in as much wisdom as I could. That's our job.

And when we take the time to sit at their feet and learn, we get to stand on their shoulders - not repeating the same mistakes, but making new ones from a greater vantage point, so our kids can learn from us.

Man's mission to make 2025 'Year of the Wrybill'

It worked for the bar-tailed god-wit back in 2015, now it's time

Twit back in 2015, now it's time for the year of the wrybill.

The "endearing" avian is in the line of sight of Keith Woodley, manager of the Pūkorokoro Miranda Shorebird Centre, who, a decade ago, managed to get the godwit voted New Zealand's Bird of the Year of the Year.

It's now the time for the wr bill, a lesser-known species with a "Swiss army knife" of a bill, to have its moment in the spotlight.

It was during the Pūkorokoro Miranda Naturalists' Trust's 40th anniversary when the campaign to get bar-tailed godwits to the top of the Bird of the Year list succeeded.

Ten years on, Keith said it was now time for "the other fellow appearing on our logo" to get a turn.

"It appears on our logo because the Firth of Thames, between late the Firth of Thames, between late December and August every year, is supporting at least 40 per cent of the world population of wrybill. They breed down south, but after they finish breeding, they all come north," he said, "and so that makes it a big deal for us."

Found only in Aotearoa New Zealand, the Waimakariri, the Rakaia, the Rangitata, and the rivers of the Mackenzie Basin are the strongholds for wrybill, and is the

strongholds for wrybill, and is the only place the birds breed.
Using a bill reminiscent of a "Swiss army knife", they scrape around beneath submerged river stones for caddisfly or mayfly lar-

vae, and it is this natural environment Keith said New Zealanders need to be "careful" of.

"We need to look after those riv-

ers. We need to maintain natural flows, and we need to be very careful with them, and these are some of the things that we want to highlight with our Year of the Wrybill because most New Zealanders, I

believe, have never heard of a wry-bill, let alone having seen one."

And seeing one - or many - is a "captivating" sight, he said, due to the bird's tendency to erupt off the roost to perform prolonged aerial

"They tend to do these lovely aerobatic displays as a tight flock," Keith said, "and so we've come up with a collective noun to describe the wrybill display - we call it a 'flung scarf' of wrybill.

"Early on in my tenure here, I was down at the hide and it was an evening tide. There were a lot of oyster catchers and a few godwits on my roost, and then they all suddenly took up and they were flying around. Then all the birds landed except the wrybill... They were just whirling around doing this loopPhoto: BRIAN CHUDLEIGH

de-loop for about half an hour," he said. "I was walking back home and dusk was falling but I could still hear them up there. Then I remembered it was actually Sat-urday night, and I thought, well, maybe this is what wrybill do on

Saturday nights."

Keith said he was optimistic that 2025 would be the Year of the Wrybill. He's started campaigning already, hoping to make people aware to vote wrybill as number one when it comes time for Forest and Bird's annual competition - which was taken out by the hoiho

yellow-eyed penguin in 2024.

The timing would suit perfectly. It is the Pūkorokoro Miranda Nat-uralists' Trust's 50th anniversary this year, and Keith said the trust has "forged a remarkable path" since its inception.

"I've been here for about 32 of those years - there's a bit of lon-gevity involved here - but it really has been an extraordinary organisation.

'There've been some great people involved all the way along... and the kind of things this trust has been able to achieve are quite

astonishing."

There will be an Open Day at the shorebird centre in October, as well as a member's lunch in August, and for anyone interested in learning more about the trust or the wrybill, contact the centre.

New proposed rate for Wharekawa Coast

A new targeted rate is being proposed by the Waikato Regional Council, for a river and catchment management programme on the Wharekawa Coast.

The proposed programme, outlined in the council's 2025/26 annual plan, will cover an area of over 20km between Waharau and Pūkorokoro/Miranda on the western shore of the Firth of Thames. The area is one of the few within the Waikato region that does not already have a formal catchment management programme.

The council said works included under the programme, such as upper catchment stability control, river management, clearing of blockages, wetland protection and enhancement, and natural erosion measures, are needed to improve the community's resilience to extreme weather events.

The work is expected to take place over the next ten years, at a cost of \$150,000 per annum. The council is proposing to fund 70 per cent of the project through a new targeted rate paid for by the Wharekawa community, and is seeking feedback on the structure of the targeted rate.

Two options have been outlined in the council's annual plan consultation document. Option one, the council's preferred option, is for direct beneficiaries of the programme (those with properties on low-lying areas of the coastal plain) to contribute more to the targeted rate - their contribution would be \$18.10 per \$100,000 of capital value (CV). Meanwhile, Wharekawa ratepayers with hilly or inland properties would pay \$4.86 per \$100,000 of CV.

Option two would consist of a flat targeted rate, with all properties in the Wharekawa community contributing \$9.95 per \$100,000 of CV.

The remaining 30 per cent of the catchment management programme's cost would be funded through the council's general rate and would amount to around \$0.02 per \$100,000 of CV for all other Waikato ratepayers, similar to other catchment management programmes in the region.



Proposed changes to summer kerbside collections

We're also proposing to change peak summer collections for rubbish and glass recycling in our east coast communities from twice weekly to once weekly.

These communities, from Whangamatā to Whangapoua, would still have rubbish, glass, mixed recycling and food waste

collected once a week from the week of Christmas to the week of Waitangi Day.

The second collection hasn't been well used. Fewer than half of properties put rubbish and glass out for the second collections and the trucks are usually finishing the day with small loads. This is not a good use of ratepayers'

money and needlessly adds to costs, pollution and vehicles on the roads.

Our proposal will only affect rubbish and glass collections in our eastern communities, but all wards will benefit from the cost savings. Eastern communities will save the most since they'll see the service change, while Thames and Coromandel-Colville wards will also benefit as the rubbish and recycling budget is partially shared district-wide.

This proposal is part of the review of our Annual Plan for 2025/26, and we want to know what you think of this potential kerbside change.

The feedback period is from 1 - 29 April.

We'll have public drop-in sessions where you can find out more and give feedback, as well as an online or paper survey to complete.
