## Election candidate dies

Thames-Coromandel Council election candidate Danny Topia has died. Topia was running for a seat on the Coromandel-Colville Community Board as part of the local body elections and was due to speak at a Meet the Candidates event in Coromandel Town

on the night he died.

According to his candidate profile, Topia was a property owner in Little Bay for 45 years and a permanent resident for 12.

For eight years he was the chairman of the Little Bay Ratepayers Association, and had previous management roles with Air New Zealand and KiwiRail.

Topia planned to utilise his past experiences to ensure that when a ratepayer or community member raised concerns, their points would be "voiced and presented to the required levels of TCDC administration". "I feel comfortable that I have an understanding of the challenges that communities within the Coromandel [and] Coromandel Rural North face."

Council extended its "heartfelt condolences" to Topia's whānau, friends, and supporters. Voting for the local body elections remains open until midday Saturday, October 11. Any votes already cast for Topia will not be counted.



# Sluggish start to local election voting

With less than two weeks left until the local body elections, just 15 per cent of Thames-Coromandel voters have returned their ballots to the box.

It's a similar story over in the Hauraki, with no more than 22 per cent of residents in each of the district's three wards casting their votes.

It's a slow start, but Thames Valley's incumbent mayors are hopeful for a late surge as election day draws near.

As of Monday, September 29, voter turnout in Thames-Coromandel had reached just over 15 per cent, with roughly 16 per cent of votes from the Thames ward; 13 per cent from Whangamatā and Mercury Bay; 16 per cent from Coromandel-Colville; and 20 per cent from Tairua-Pāuanui.

The district's Mayor, Len Salt, who is seeking re-election, said the level of returns so far was low and "concerning".

"Not just to me, but to all the candidates and people involved in the election process," he said.

He encouraged voters to research the candidates, and find out if their policies and values aligned "not only with you, but with what is achievable, and what is best for our whole dis-

He also said it was "crucial" to engage in the election process through the proper channels. "People will often react to important issues online, and this can be seen in higher levels of social media activity.

"Council often seeks public input, but social media comments aren't counted as official submissions or votes," he said.

"So I encourage voters to en-

gage with the candidates, look at past council meetings, read meeting notes and take a look at the long term and annual plans. See which candidates and values align with what you wish to see for the future of the district, and most importantly, vote."

Meanwhile, in the Hauraki district, roughly 18 per cent of voters had returned their ballots from within the Plains ward; 21 per cent from Paeroa; and 17 per

cent from Waihī.

At the 2022 local body elections, Hauraki had less than half of its eligible voters across the three wards return votes, an average of 40.6 per cent overall.

The Plains ward had a 41.13 per cent return; Paeroa had 41.34 per cent, and Waihī just 39.48 per cent.

Incumbent Mayor Toby Adams, also seeking another term, said voting levels were "cur-

rently tracking about the same as in previous years" but hoped to see a bigger turnout this election.

"There's still time to vote so if you haven't yet, please make sure you do," he said.

"This is not just about Hauraki - it is important across all areas. Your vote really does make a difference and your voice matters."

In 2022, Thames-Coromandel had a slightly more positive result compared to its Hauraki neighbours, with an overall of 51.4 per cent of its eligible voters participating.

# Straight-shooter' plans shake up

As this year's local elections approach, reporter KELLEY TANTAU continues to put the spotlight on the mayoral contenders, and asks why they think they're fit to wear the chains.

The interview with Thames-Coro-▲ mandel mayoral contender James Subritzky opens with a discussion on mining.

The first-time candidate asks if The *Profile* has been following the posts he's been putting up on Facebook. The answer is ves.

"Well, I must have struck a raw nerve or two, that's for sure," Subrtizky says.

He's alluding to a post he shared on a local Coromandel noticeboard earlier that day, which outlines his vision for the district.

Bring in the miners, let them dig out the gold - \$140 billion worth. A lot of what they dig out gets used to build new seawalls for coastal defence," he wrote.

'As the miners reclaim land behind them, they create new building platforms and install infrastructure, handing back to the community land ready to build on.

"Well, hey, it's just a post," he says, "and that's where I stand.'

Subritzky is a self-described "straight shooter" and when asked how he'd tackle a difference of opinion around the council table, he doesn't mince his words.

"I am very fiery and I don't back down. So it's been suggested to me - and I must admit it is probably the best answer - just lock me in the garage [during meetings] and let me tinker with my car,

I'll have it all up on a big screen and I'll be able to hear it and communicate to [elected members], but I just won't be there in public to slap them on the back of the head."

Having owned properties in Auckland and Queenstown, Subritzky says Thames is now his home and where he envisions himself long-term.

But his motivation to run for local politics began three decades ago in Aus-

tralia.
"I met the mayor of the North Sydney, Manly, area, and at the time he had an issue about trees, and I said: 'Why don't you simply adopt a one-for-five-for-five approach?' He said: 'What's that?' and I said: 'Well, if a developer needs to knock a tree out, then he has to plant five natives and guarantee them for five years, to allow them to establish themselves'. And it was one way of looking at both sides of the story," he explains.
"When [the mayor] walked away, I

felt so chuffed because just off the top of my head I'd said that, and I just felt like politics or local body politics was something I'd like to look at later on.'

Subrtizky says he'll enjoy flying "over the hill" to the eastern side of the district once he finishes obtaining his Private Pilot Licence.

He says he's done his hours and passed all his exams, except one: navigation.

Even so, the former navy man and bathroom renovator believes a vote for him is "a tick in the right direction".

'I've looked at the candidates, none of them even think like I do.

"I don't just stand for transparency, I stand for exposing the truth... and a lot of people, I think, in the Coromandel, just want the truth explained to them, he savs.

"I'm not cut from the same mould as anybody else. Now is the best chance for change, because if I come back in three years, chances are, I would have been poisoned and my mind polluted. So now is the best chance for change.

## Luxury yacht sinks at Slipper Island

A luxury yacht on its way to Whangārei on September 21 sank for the second time this year while being towed. The Waikato Regional Harbourmaster

said information about the *Maritimo* yacht indicated it sank in the South Bay of Slipper Island as water had entered the open engine

'No oil or other hazardous contaminants were aboard as it was a previously-salvaged vessel and these were removed as part of the recovery process

"It's currently still sitting on the seabed in around 4 metres of water, but has been anchored which should minimise any shifting.

"Please be aware if you're in the area of Slipper Island as salvage operations may be

The 18.2 metre vessel first sank on May 16 after it crashed into some rocks near Motiti Island, Tauranga.

"The current salvors are onsite and have reported some oil sheen on the water as a result of residual oils in the engine bay.

"Some sorbents have now been deployed to mop up residual oil and the vessel salvage is being managed privately between the owner and the salvage company.

The public is encouraged to avoid the area to allow for salvage.





# First Conservationist Award winners announced

The Mangatangi Maramarua Catchment has named the first winners of its inaugural Young Conservationist Awards - Fletcher Grant, Lockie Grant, and Ashton Williamson.

A spokesperson said the young men had built a deep understanding and first-hand knowledge of the damage invasive pest species inflicted on the environment.

Their interest in conservation started in 2020 when they were still at primary school.

Since that time, they have dispatched over 2000 possums.

"Our biggest night was 100 but we are struggling to find that many now on land we have regular access to," Fletcher said.

Living close to the Firth of Thames, Hunua Ranges and Maramarua Forest provides proximity to large areas of significant bush blocks and waterways.

Welcomed on a number of local farms, the trio focuses on controlling possums, hares and turkeys. Such is their success that local landowners are hoping to secure access to more land so other areas can benefit.

Ask them what their top tips for possum control are and like most young men, they are keen on using the latest kit.

"The easiest way to kill possums is to shoot them at night using thermal imaging," Fletcher said.

The awards are designed to encourage the next generations' stewardship of the land and build awareness of the vital role pest management plays in saving New Zealand's critically endangered native wildlife.

The Mangatangi Maramarua Catchment Young Conservationist Award will be held monthly until December, and includes a \$100 Hunting and Fishing voucher for pest control activity within the the catchment.

# Karaka Track transformed

What was once an overgrown, dark corridor of invasive privet, wattle, and elaeagnus has been getting a major makeover thanks to the Thames Environmental Alliance (TEA).

Volunteers have been hard at work clearing invasive weeds at the Karaka Track carpark and entrance, setting the old road reserve on a new course. The track is one of the most popular trails in Thames - a starting point for trampers heading into the Coromandel Forest Park to Crosbies Hut, and the Karaka to Waiotahi circuit.

Spokesperson Ric Balfour said the Karaka Track restoration project will be a sustained effort over the next few years, building on years of work from the Thames Mountain Bike Club, which has maintained and upgraded the track and bridges, and set a trapline on the Karaka and Waiotahi tracks.

"The Karaka carpark restoration is a multi-phase project," he said.

"TEA has cleared privet and other invasive weeds, chipped the branches, and donated the firewood to locals. They are now treating more than 1000 privet stumps, clearing years of rubbish, and starting to plant and mulch.

"Next year, TEA will monitor and weed new seedlings, rehabilitate the poor soil,



and continue planting native species, with a three-year maintenance plan in place until nature can take over."

Future work is also being scoped to enhance the nearby waterfall area and extend weeding further up the track, as well as other weed hot spots around Thames

er weed hot spots around Thames.

The Thames Environmental Alliance is a newly formed charitable trust on a mission to tackle the town's invasive weed problem, restore native biodiversity, control pests, and enhance local walking trails.

Its projects have included opening the Moanataiari Lookout Track with The Department of Conservation, removing privet, wattle and asparagus weed in the Sir John William Hall Arboretum, and engaging an ecologist to run privet trials to find the best way to approach the hills of privet plaguing Thames.

Thames Environmental Alliance has gained support from the Thames Community Board, Thames-Coromandel District Council, Predator Free Hauraki Coromandel, the Department of Conservation and the Seagull Centre. There has also been a huge amount of volunteer time both on the ground and behind the scenes.

Born and bred in Tairua, the Coromandel has always been a huge inspiration to her, the beaches, fishing, nature, the freedom; it all played an important part in sparking her creativity. Jessie describes her art style as an intuitive, playful and richly layered expression of colour, character and emotion, with a touch of quirkiness. Each piece captures a joyful journey with the essence captures a joyful journey with the essence of storytelling. She works with acrylic and mixed media, building layers until she can see where the painting is taking her. Trained as a graphic designer, she has always been a doodler so painting intuitively allows her to express herself freely.

Colour, texture and mark making are the biggest inspirations for her work.

As an intuitive painter Jessie says she lets.

As an intuitive painter, Jessie says she lets the painting direct her as opposed to forcing preconceived notions of what it should be.

It's about the process and the art is a dialogue between herself and her work.

The layers are created to reflect current

moments in time - emotions, thoughts and ideas. Jessie says art for her is about the journey not the destination, so often when she starts a painting she has no idea what it will become. She works with a lot of layers, textures and marks before taking a step back and working out what she can see.
She says it's not too dissimilar to find-

ing shapes in the clouds or faces in knots of wood, but she also likes to add little details and surprises so the viewer sees something new every time they look at it - this helps her build depth and interest as well.

The layers tend to contain a lot of scratching, scribbling, stencils and experimenta-tion. Jessie says that it's not unusual for a painting to completely change direction if

she's suddenly inspired by a colour combination or a certain mark or section of the piece. Sometimes when she feels completely stuck on a piece she will intentionally make some bold moves to spark some new inspiration. It's about covering up parts to make room for parts she loves. Meanwhile, Denise Judd will be featuring

her unique pottery at the northern end of the gallery. Denise has lived in the Thames area for most of her life, now residing on the Thames Coast. She began potting more than 20 years ago after seeing an ad in the paper for classes at the local art gallery, where there were two great tutors who taught the basics, hand building, wheel work and the most important part, how to glaze, which can turn a basic pot into an amazing piece of art form. From then on she was hooked on

# Spring colours appear

ctober is mid spring and the colours October is find spring and the trees are a pretty good indication of what is to come. It is one of the busiest and most exciting months in the garden. Everything is bursting into life and looking a picture.

Tasks for the month include preparation of the soil with good compost ready for the new plants. Continue vegetable planting such as peas, broccoli, cauliflower, beetroot, and salad greens. Toward the end of the month, you can add cucumbers, eggplant, beans, zucchini, sweetcorn.

If you are planting vegetables in pots make sure you have a premium potting mix to give your plants the best start. Plant your summer lettuces, spinach, herbs and tomatoes, which all grow well in pots.

Tidy up the herb gardens by cutting back sage, thyme and mint to encourage new growth. Plant basil, coriander, parsley and dill to go with those summer barbecue dishes

Continue to mound up potatoes with soil to protect them from wind and the possibility of late frost. It also encourages good tuber growth. Mound up until approximately 300mm high.

Labour Weekend is traditionally tomato planting time, so if it is warm enough, get them in the ground so you have a bumper crop come Christmas. Remember to stake them at time of planting so you don't disturb the roots once they are established.

Feed your seedlings with a specific fertiliser for tomatoes and vegetables. Seaweed plant tonic can be used between fertiliser application. And don't forget to protect

your new seedlings with slug and snail bait. Citrus fruit of most varieties will have

reached maturity although there will be some late fruiters. Fertilise all fruit trees starting in early October.

Plant out young passionfruit vines in a sunny north facing position, this is best suited to their growth.

Keep an eye on your strawberries and pick some of the flowers off to encourage good plant growth and delay the fruiting to help extend the season.

The roses will have early blooms starting to appear and plant growth will be rapid. Water well and be vigilant about the first signs of pests.

Plant some popular spring flowers such as lobelia, dahlia, cosmos, gerbera, marigolds, sweet peas. It's a good idea to have some of these in pots and place around or close to the vegetable beds to attract bees.

Don't forget the slug and snail protection, and fertiliser.

Adding mulch to the garden will also help to add warmth to the soil to encourage growth and also suppress the weeds.

Now is the time to spray the lawn with a specific prickle weed spray, to retain the perfect playground for the kids. These sprays can be purchased at your local hardware stores or garden centres. Apply weed and feed to the lawn to keep it green and

Stimulate the compost bin with the addition of lime and nitrogen fertiliser and turn or agitate to aerate.


The young athlete was keen on other sports too, and said he put some of his winnings towards a golf membership at Waikere Golf Club, and saved the rest.




