For one, it'll be business as usual. For another, a rise up the district council ranks.

Preliminary results for the local body elections show Hauraki voters sticking with Mayor Toby Adams, while Thames-Coromandel elevates councillor Peter Revell to the top job.

As of Sunday night, Adams had earned 4694 votes, while Revell had 3669.

After acknowledging his clear win with a celebration in Paeroa with other successful candidates, Mayor Adams told *The Profile* that out of his 15 years in council, this campaign was particularly full-on.

"There's normally always going

to be people out there that don't like you or don't like your politics, and I 100 per cent get that. There's also people that do like you. So, the supportive ones have been fantastic," he said.

"I tried to shut out the noise, but it was more personal, I'll say. Rather than just politics, it became very, very personal with one of the candidates invading personal space, and just the level of enquiries were more personal than ever before."

As with his past bids for the mayoralty, Adams kept it simple on the 2025 campaign trail, and said "doing your job properly" was the best indicator of earning another term.

He was the only mayoral candidate who turned up to any of the Meet the Candidate events across

"If you're the incumbent mayor, you're campaigning for three years by just doing your job properly, and if you've done your job properly, you'll get a whiff of whether you're the right person or not to stand." he said.

not to stand," he said.

"If I was getting a sense that the community was over me, I probably wouldn't have stood."

But Adams was the clear victor.

But Adams was the clear victor. His closest competitor was out-of-towner Roman Jackson on 622 votes, followed by Waihi's Levi Burton on 474, both new to local politics.

What surprised Adams, though, was the number of other experienced mayors ousted from their roles across the country - many of them female. Three-term Selwyn mayor Sam Broughton conceded victory to Lydia Gliddon; seasoned Central Hawke's Bay Mayor Alex Walker lost her campaign against Will Foley; Waikato District Mayor Jacqui Church was defeated in the polls by Aksel Bech; Susan O'Reagan from Waipā was ousted by Mike Pettit, and Tararua mayor Tracey Collis - who has been in the role since 2016 - was unseated by Scott Gilmore.

"All these good mayors with great knowledge and understanding of how it all works are gone,

and I don't think they're gone for the reason that people think they've done a poor job," Adams said. "I think they're gone because some of these communities can't comprehend these rising costs... and we don't just do it to piss people off."

While Adams has long been a familiar face around the council table, Revell isn't exactly green himself.

The Thames-based father-offour began his local politics career as a community board member before moving into a councillor role in 2022. On Saturday, he told *The Profile* a commendable campaign helped ease any electionday jitters. **CONTINUED P2**

"I was really content, I suppose, with the job that I had done in the campaign. There were a few things that I would do differently, but overall I felt that if I missed out, it's not because I hadn't done a decent job on the campaign. So, it hasn't been a nervous day for me, but it has been a busy day," he said.

Revell was getting ready to host family for his father-in-law's 95th birthday celebrations on Sunday. His job - amid taking hoardings off the trailer and pulling nails out of wood - was to keep an eye on the bolar roast. "We will sit around and do what families do, which is sit and chat and what have you," he said. "There will be a certain topic a flavour to the conversation - which will be around the change in my life that's going to take place from Monday morning, but it will

be very much a family weekend."
Family and faith, Revell said, were two "fundamentals" of his life.

'We've got four kids, we've got 16 grandchildren... so we've got a bevy of young family, which is incredibly energising - and unbelievably chaotic at Christmas time.

Revell added that while he was not surprised by the way the vote went, he acknowledged the disappointment that came handin-hand on election day.

"More people didn't vote for me as mayor than did vote for me as mayor," he said, al-luding to the 3069, 2993, and 1525 votes cast for fellow candidates Patrick Kerr, incumbent Len Salt, and Denise Messiter re-

"So that's a reality. There's a whole lot of people out there who, in the mayoral outcome, will be disappointed because their candidate didn't get over the line. And around the council table, there will be people who will be coping with real disappointment at the moment.

An unexpected outcome was the close race in the Mercury Bay ward, he said, in which sitting councillors Deli Connell and Rekha Giri-Percival were nipped at the post by Flemming Rasmussen and former deputions of the council and ty mayor Tony Brljevich.

Coromandel-Colville candidate John

Morrissey, who first won an uncontested seat on the Thames-Coromandel District Council in 2004 and served two terms, returned successfully in 2019 but was also edged out by newcomer Robert Ashman this election.

And in the vote to remove or retain Māori Wards, it was clear in both districts: with 6896 votes against and 4771 in favour in Thames-Coromandel, and 3248 votes against and 2340 in favour in Hauraki, the wards will be gone at the 2028 election.

"I'm not surprised that the 2028 election.
"I'm not surprised that that's the way the vote has gone," Revell said, "because I've been campaigning around the district since the beginning of the year, and the more I was moving around the district, the more sense I got that the referendum was likely to

"But the reality is that we have got a Māori ward - we've got a Māori ward for the next three years, and we've got a very capable representative

Like Revell, Mayor Adams said he was looking forward to working with the Māori ward councillors while he could, but expressed disappointment in the timing of the referendum.

"I don't know if the result would have changed if we had more voter engagement, but it's just kind of disappointing that we were put in a position to do this before the community had actually experienced what Māori wards were, and could realise that it's no big deal and it's not about race, it's just about diversity around the table," he said.

Final election results are expected to be released on October 17, and in Thames-Coromandel, the new mayor, councillors, and community board members will be officially

sworn in on October 31.



# New mural to paint bigger picture for Paeroa

Paeroa could soon be even more 'world famous'. This time, for its walls.

Spearheaded by the Paeroa Business Association and largely funded by the Hauraki District Council's Public Art Fund, a new mural showcasing the town's landscape will be installed on the side of E Ronnie's Café on Corbett St, replacing an older artwork that currently occupies the wall.

cupies the wall.

Project lead Linley Rose told The Profile a new mural had been in the making for almost a year, following the business association's formation in October, 2024.

Following a search for the right artist, the team landed on Wellington-based Regan Balzer to bring the mural to life.

"Her designs are more abstract and colourful, but still are able to tell a story," Linley said.
Regan [Te Arawa, Ngāti
Ranginui, Raukawa, Apakura]

She has participated in a number of exhibitions throughout New Zealand as well as overseas, including Italy, America, Australia, Rarotonga and Tahiti.

sociation had a "really positive and really wonderful" consultation with local iwi at Ngahutoitoi Marae, which Regan was a part of

part of.
And at the start of the year, locals were asked to share their thoughts on what the mural should depict and how it should

be styled

The results of the survey revealed a strong preference for a design that was contemporary, vibrant, and connected to the local environment, Linley said.

"Because what makes Paeroa so special is its environment: the rivers and the mountains. Photo: ALICE PARMINTER

"The river is why we're here."
According to council's Public Arts Policy, proposals put forward for funding needed to showcase new artistic practices that would add innovation to Hauraki's public art scene; have high standards of artistic excellence; reflect and incorpo-

rate the diversity of culture in the district; and recount Māori whakapapa and history, or celebrate Māori culture - with approval given by Mana Whenua.

One of the reasons Linley was chosen to lead the project was her passion for street art, and how it could revitalise cities and enhance town spaces.

She hoped this latest mural

She hoped this latest mural could kickstart a wave of creativity in Paeroa.

"A lot of cities around the world that are known for their murals have competitions each year, and so businesses are happy to be part of something that is a big event in their towns.

"That's not how we've structured it in Paeroa yet, but maybe that's a future possibility," she said.

"I want this mural to inspire possibilities for more art, for more stories to be told."

The Corbett St wall has been cleaned and stripped of lichen, ready for sealing and undercoating ahead of Regan starting her work on October 25. The mural will have its official opening one month later.



# Reunion on calendar for Thames alum

They left Thames chasing op-portunities, but Rob Comer and Shane Brealey haven't forgotten their roots.

Each of the men have gone

on to experience varied careers: one became a professional firefighter and private investigator. the other built transport tions, schools, and affordable housing across the country.

Now, a reunion is on the cards for the Thames High alumni, and they're hoping more of the old crew will come along for a catch up.

For Rob, leaving school before getting his School Certificate was what he called a "stupid" move, but after a short stint at the district council, he went back to finish up and left for good in 1979.

From there, he went "from job to job" in Thames, and while volunteering as firefighter at the local brigade, he was inspired by a fellow member who'd be-

come a professional firefighter in Auckland City. "Something just clicked for me, so I started making plans to get fit and pass the necessary requirements to join as well.

After his firefighting stint in Auckland - "definitely the best job in the world," he said - Rob moved into the scuba diving industry, then worked with the New Zealand Police.

A few years later, he and his family relocated to the Gold Coast, Australia, where he set

up a private investigation (PI) company. But while the weather was warm and the vibe was good, Rob said he quickly realised Australia had a "very dark underbelly," especially in the investigative world.

After a decade in the PI game, he felt it was once again "time to change what I did".

Rob returned to New Zealand and joined Air New Zealand's long-haul cabin crew, later developing two accommodation lodges and moving to Waiheke Island, where he became a zipline guide. Of his varied career, Rob said change happened when the timing was right.

He was also inspired by other Thames High alumni who had

'really done well," he said - like Shane Brealey.

Shane is known for establishing NZ Living, which developed and built 700 new homes in Auckland - sold to first-home buyers at a total of \$30 million and a market value to help more

under market value to help more people on to the property ladder.
At one point, NZ Living was the largest provider of KiwiBuild homes, Shane said, and he later gifted the company to the Similarity Vicios and home plicity KiwiSaver scheme.

Before all that though, he was

a Thames High student, having done his schooling there from 1976-1980.

From there, he went on to earn a Bachelor of Civil Engi-neering from the University

of Canterbury, then spent two ears working in Hawke's Bay, followed by another two in London. He later worked with major Australian firms before return ing to New Zealand to establish his own construction company, NZ Strong.
Shane told *The Profile* that

over the next decade, NZ Strong delivered 74 projects, includ-ing 11 transport stations, five schools, the Tepid Baths refurbishment, Auckland Zoo Te Wao Nui, the MOTAT Aviation Display Hall, Pah Homestead, Lopdell House and Art Gallery, the Auckland Netball Centre, the Ōtāhuhu Recreation Centre, and many more

ing. Since 2021, he and his wife ing. Since 2021, he are and Anna have been working probono running Simplicity Living, currently building about 600 new homes per year in Auckland and Queenstown to provide more affordable rental

housing.

# New book reveals Paeroa history

People will soon be able to experience a whole new side to Paeroa' history, with the launch of True Tales of the Paeroa Ward.

The book, due to be released on October 17, is a collection of essays and stories from people with memories of the rural Waikato town. It's been a labour of

love six years in the making.
"It was a very slow process.
[The books] normally only take about two years to go from start to finish at the most," editor Geraldine Dunwoodie said.

"But we wanted to get it fin-ished. And then all of a sud-den we had one lovely lady who wrote several stories herself and also sent links to all sorts of genealogy groups... Another lady right at the last minute managed to get another three or four stories in quite quickly."

True Tales takes quite a different angle from traditional history books.

It's all things that you don't find in the newspapers or the history books, and you see photos that perhaps will remain in family hands and normally not be available," Geraldine said. "It's a jolly good range of sto-

ries: everything from looking at early family history, to current family, early businesses to current businesses, including The Refinery where we're having the book launch. And for the businesses, of course, we've got The

Valley Profile.
"World War II gets a mention, schools get a mention. And

there's quite a bit on some of the early hotels of Paeroa, and some landmarks.

Geraldine said it was hard to pick a favourite from the many different recountings included in the volume. One thing the stories have in common though, is

authenticity.
"We don't actually change the author's stories. We might put in the odd comma or take out some-thing that's been put in twice, but that's all we do. We like the different flavours of the authors to come through.

The stories came from far and wide - she even received two submissions from Ireland, Geraldine said.

"Another story came to us from Switzerland, too," she said. "I've been nagging for that par-ticular story for a couple of years.

It was a friend of my husband's, people well-known in the area, so that was lovely to have that

# Fundraiser seeks good reads

The Zonta Club of Thames The Zonta Club of Thamed Valley is looking forward to another successful Bookarama event this Labour Weekend - if it

can round up enough books.

The annual Bookarama is the club's major fundraiser event for the year, and Zonta members Sue Bowden and Christine Alley are putting out the call for more donations.

Last year, the event raised around \$8000 for various charities, scholarships and grants to benefit girls and women throughout the region and overseas. The two-day event saw trestle tables loaded down with thousands of donated, second-hand books,

and a crowd of people to match.

"There is often a queue, a whole lot of people there with all their big bags," Sue said.

But this year, Christine said, they only have around half the number of books they need.

"When we first started, Ngatea never had [a book fair], Paeroa never had one, and Waihī never had one... We've got a bit of competition now."

The pair said novels, historical works, children's and New Zealand books were the most popular, but they would take any genre, as well as bulk lots like deceased estate books.

Donation can be dropped off at the Paeroa iSite or Thames ANZ, or picked up directly by arrangement. Help in the form of volunteers is also welcome, the pair said. Zonta has the assistance of Never Surrender Fitness to move the books to the hall from their storage space at the Thames Sta-bles, and other community volunteers to run the event itself.

"But we'd love some more members," Christine said. "We used to have about 40 people we're down to about nine at the moment.'

It's a pretty relaxed, social group, Sue said, with a keen focus on empowering women and girls. The group gives out regular scholarships for furthering education, for example: paying out for small expenses like petrol and car warrants that aren't often covered by grants but can make all the difference in achieving success. "It does feel like it's making an impact on people's lives," Christine said. "Anything you can do to help, right?"

# lifetime of music, friends, and memories

#### Rowan Garrett 1936 - 2025

When Rowan Garrett took his final bow, it marked the end of an era for the Kerepēhi Brass Band.

It began in 1946 when Rowan was just 10 years old and his piano teacher, Mr Vivian, invited him to join a new brass band.

Rowan picked up the cornet, before finding his way to the E flat bass.

He never left.

When he died on August 26, 89-year-old Rowan was just a few months shy of 80 years' service with the band.

Rowan was more than a musician; he was the beating heart of the Kerepēhi Brass Band, reads a tribute on the band's website. And current president Luke van Vliet agrees.

"He was a role model for a lot of people in the way he lived his life and how he conducted himself," Luke said.

"He lived right there [behind the band hall]... he would alwavs walk over here to practice every day.

"Brass bands are very community-based, it really becomes your family. And that's what it was for Rowan, you know? Pretty much all of his kids were in the band at some point.'

"Anzac Day this year, he was so gutted when he couldn't be there, because that's what he was working towards after he broke his femur.

Every time I was on the phone to him, he was talking about how he was going to be at band practice within three weeks, and he was working hard, and he's

been studying the music, and he was always optimistic.

Through the years, Rowan's dedication was also recognised outside the band. He was made a life member of the Waikato Bay of Plenty Brass Band Association, received a Hauraki District Citizens award in 2004, and in 2021 he was awarded the services to brass bands.

Perhaps his favourite accolade though, was an in-depth interview with TVNZ's Seven Sharp in 2021.

"That was probably one of the big highlights in his banding career. He never stopped talking about it," Luke said.

Fittingly, Rowan's final public performance with the band was also filmed by Seven Sharp, when the TV crew accompanied the band to their Christmas performance in the hills and tunnels of Karangahake Gorge last vear.

Even after Rowan's health began to decline, music, and the band, were still foremost in his mind. Fellow band member Heather O'Hagan recalled visiting him just days before his death, to find him preparing to fit some music practice into his

"He was a regular attendee [of the senior social band] up until the end of last year," she said in her eulogy

"And he was delighted to play with them when they visited [Ohinemuri Home] in June.'

Rowan's legacy was one of music, friendship, and community spirit, the band said.

"[He] will live on in every note we play."

# Potatoes, beer, and something in the water



As part of a Valley Profile series, MEGHAN HAWKES searches through old newspapers to bring you the stories Thames Valley locals once read about themselves.

#### 1939

At Kōpū, settlers were attempting to combat a worm menace with sand supplied by the Public Works department.

The department was prepared to cart 50 or 60 yards to any suitable area near Kōpū where it could be used for experimental worm work by the settlers.

Also at Kōpū a record number of crafts were observed at the bridge in one day between the hours of 3am and 10pm.

A total of 19 vessels of all types were counted, eclipsing the previous record of shipping in the Waihōu River, 14, which had been noted several years previously.

Something else appeared to be in the water at Kōpū – the small country school having four sets of twins amongst its pupils.

Meanwhile, the Thames

Meanwhile, the Thames Coast Rd was declared a menace to life and limb by resident Mr McLonghlin at a meeting of the Thames County Council.

He requested an estimate for tarsealing the road from the Thames borough bound-



ary to Waiomu, and for sealing the length in Tapu be obtained. Metal was no use, as it was only chewed up into dust. "I would like to see the Minister of Public Works come here at present, so he could gain an idea of what the people have to put up with," he added.

Over in Miranda, a new shell

Over in Miranda, a new shell lime grinding mill had been built to replace a similar structure destroyed by fire. A large number of farmers from the district paid a visit to the works. The modern plant was seen in operation, and the farmers who examined the lime as it came from the hoppers were delighted with its fineness.

There were unlimited quantities of green shell available, and many favourable comments were made by farmers concerning the great pastoral value of this product of the sea, which appeared to possess ingredients eagerly sought after by cattle.

In Paeroa, a country wide 'potato famine' had fortunately left the township untouched. Potato supply had been a problem for dealers and consumers and prices soared as stocks diminished. The South Island had no potatoes at all and an Auckland merchant declared: "We have not enough old potatoes to supply a decent boardinghouse." However, in Paeroa old potatoes were still procurable at two pence less than Wellington and new potatoes of very fine quality were also available.

ity were also available.

"Paeroa is very lucky," said a man of wide experience in the fruit and vegetable trade.

"You are getting the finest quality of vegetables in New Zealand and at a price comparable with any other town too."

Paeroa housewives had reason to be satisfied with the variety and quality of fresh vegetables available to them.

A 'beer strike' at Waihī was organised by the Ohinemuri Mines and Batteries' Union in reaction to an increased price of the beverage.

Waihī hotels were declared 'black' and a notice to this effect was served on hotel proprietors.

After a month the 'beer strike' was called off with the almost immediate effect that all four hotels again buzzed with activity, although for four weeks those who had frequented them had found them very dull places.



#### HELICOPTER FLYBYS

Powerco is using a low flying helicopter to inspect sections of its rural network in the Coromandel, Hauraki and South Waikato area in October and November. The work is part of a pole top photography survey, which will take high resolution aerial photos of more than 29,000 power poles, lines and associated hardware across Powerco's North Island electricity network. This allows Powerco to assess the condition of its assets, check for any potential issues such as trees growing into lines, and fix them before they cause power cuts. The work

in the Coromandel, Hauraki and South Waikato area is planned from October 22 to November 5, however this timeframe may be extended if there's bad weather. The low flying helicopter will follow Civil Aviation Authority regulations, only flying above 300 metres in urban areas, and above 150 metres in rural areas. More info: www.powerco.co.nz/helicopter.

# It's time to sort bull teams

Dr Neil Murray BSVc, Farm Vet, Paeroa

With mating just around the corner, now is the time to sort your bull teams. Ideally, bulls should be on the farm at least three weeks before going out with the herd.

This allows them to work out their social hierarchy beforehand so they can focus on the cows once they are added to the herd rather than fighting each other.

Ensure that virgin bulls are used and that they are certified as BVD-free and vaccinated for Lepto and BVD. Ask specifically for documentation stating this.

A veterinary examination of bulls is recommended before they begin work.

When performing fertility checks, it's not uncommon to find bulls that are not fit for service. Common reasons for a bull to be not fit for service include small testicles, penis deformities or poor sperm viability.

The number of bulls required will depend on how many cows are likely to come on heat while the bulls are with the group.

Bulls should be used at a ratio of 1:30 for

cows and 1:20 for R2 heifers.

Use two teams of bulls rotating one

Use two teams of bulls, rotating one team every 1-2 days, to reduce the risk of lameness and fatigue.
For example, a 300-cow herd with a 50

per cent in-calf rate when the bulls go out will require five bulls per term and therefore, 10 bulls in total.

Bulls need to be checked regularly for

lameness, illness, or injury, and replaced with new bulls if any are identified.

Infections, antibiotic treatment, and elevated temperatures affect sperm production for 30+ days, making them ineffective

for use. Encourage bulls to stay in the pad-

dock during milkings, as reducing time on concrete yarding will also help lower lameness incidence.

Teaser bulls are a great way to improve heat detection on your farm.

While their presence in the herd doesn't improve the cows' condition, they will ride the cows harder, making rub marks more noticeable.

We can vasectomise bulls at any age; this can even be done as young calves at debudding time to avoid the need for another sedation.

# New Hauraki Gulf protections passed

The Hauraki Gulf Tikapa Mo-ana Marine Protection Act was passed into law by Parliament on October 8, providing greater protections to 800km of the Gulf's sea habitats.

The Act will extend the existing Te Whanganui-o-Hei/Cathedral Cove and Cape Rodney-Okakari Point marine reserves. It will also introduce five seafloor protection areas, where activities which disturb seafloor habitats are excluded; and 12 high protection areas, prohibiting commercial and recreational fishing.

The Act still allows for ac-

tive restoration activities with a permit, and customary rights of tangata whenua with writ-ten authorisation from a Tangata Kaitiaki (local guardian or trustee), within the protected areas.

There is also provision in the Act for a limited amount of ring-net fishing within the high protection areas; however Conservation Minister Tama Potaka said the impact of this would be minimal.

"Limited local ring-net fishing for common species will only be allowed in three per cent of the total protected area. This will be reviewed after

three years," he said.

The Department of Conservation (DOC) said the Act would triple protection in the Gulf, from six per cent to about

18 per cent.
"This will support the re-

"This will support the recovery of some of its most biodiverse regions, including its nearshore areas and deep reefs," DOC said.

"The protection areas are only one part [of] the Revitalising the Gulf plan. Others are being rolled out, including fisheries measures, work to restore natural habitats and address natural habitats and address land-based impacts." Coromandel MP Scott Simp-

son said it was the biggest boost to marine protection in nearly 50 years.

"A healthy Hauraki Gulf is essential to our region, and this Bill ensures that it is getting the care it deserves.

The Hauraki Gulf/Tikapa Moana Marine Protection Act is a culmination of a decade of work by iwi, environmental groups, fishers, tourism op-erators and other community groups, which began with the Sea Change Tai Timu Tai Pari plan in 2013.

It will come into force before the end of 2025.

# Students enjoy new 'outdoor classroom

ing, organisers say. The first-ever Oke Outdoor Classroom Week ran from Sep tember 15 to 19, and Kopuarahi School, which worked with Oke to build gardens in August, was quick to participate.

Oke is a charity which partners with schools to build gardens for children to learn and thrive in.

Principal Chris Patel said the school garden functioned as an outdoor classroom that was

central to the education curriculum for her students, with everything from fractions to soil science to persuasive writing taught in outdoor spaces.
"Inside, often kids get dis-

tracted and lose focus, but I find it easier to keep their attention when we're outside learning in the garden," she said. "Most kids need to move about; they need to be outside and standing up regularly. I had a student tell me that planting in the garden was one of the most satisfying things they'd ever done.
"It's good for me too to get

outside for a walk, it's a win-

Oke chief executive Paul Dickson calls them "outdoor classrooms".

"There is an urgent need for all children to feel connected and we know that kids who feel connected tend to learn better," he said. "Children who struggle with

inside learning, often thrive outside, while all kids benefit from the well-being aspects of learning outside.

"It's good for the teachers, too. We hear from schools about the excited buzz when children learn in an outdoor classroom.

#### RUGRY

Meads Cup Semi Final – South Canterbury v Thames Valley

For the second consecutive year Thames Valley will battle it out with Mid Canterbury for the Meads Cup.

A memorable 61-31 semi final victory over South Canterbury at Timaru last Saturday has enabled the Swamp Foxes to swoop into the final.

This time Mid Canterbury will have home advantage as the final of the Bunnings Warehouse Heartland Championship will be played at Ashburton next Saturday.

Conditions at the semi final were ideal for running rugby with South Canterbury having the advantage of a strong wind in the first half, which Thames Valley enjoyed after the break.

The crowd were entertained with a total of eleven tries being scored, all of which were converted.

Superior play enabled the Swamp Foxes to notch up seven of these tries – all converted by Quinn Collard who also kicked four penalty goals.

Aporosa Vuniyayawa, the loan player from Counties Manukau, was in dynamic form at Number 8 and scored four tries, which equals the Thames Valley record for the most tries by a player in a match.

With 26 points from his seven conversions and four penalty goals Quinn Collard has now scored 146 points so far this season which is a new Thames Valley record.

Even though Thames Valley had an advantage of territory and possession in the first half, South

Canterbury made the most of their limited opportunities and at half time the score was tied at 24 all

Immediately after the break South Canterbury broke through from their own half to score a try. With the conversion they took the lead: 31-24.

From then on, the Swamp Foxes were in control. Sione Etoni, Finley Davenport and Logan Allen scored tries before Vuniyayawa added his final touchdown.

As well as the conversions Collard added three penalty goals, to go with one that he had kicked in the first half, and his side ended the game with a very satisfying 61-31 victory.

This was an excellent effort by Thames Valley with all twentythree players performing at a very high level.

In the other semi final Mid Canterbury defeated a very determined Wairarapa Bush team 21-19 at Ashburton.

North Otago will host Horowhenua Kapiti in the final for the Lochore Cup.


